ABOUT

The Italian language and Culture Summer School aims to give its participants an experience of Italian language and culture in a unique setting. Classes will take place in Via S.Maria 36, at walking distance from Miracle Square, and the world famous Leaning Tower.

Who can apply?

The Summer School is open to university students and professionals. Students preparing for Italian University enrolment may also apply (students must be accompanied by a parent/guardian if under 18 when the programme commences).

COURSES

Italian Language Courses (levels A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, minimum 8 students)

Special Subject Courses (Music, Art, Literature, minimum 5 students)

Plenary lectures and Evening lectures

BASIC OPTION: 60h Italian Language Course (morning courses)

INTENSIVE COURSE: 60h+12h one Special Subject Course (afternoon course) or 60h+24h two Special Subject Course (afternoon courses)

Social and recreational programme

A range of optional excursions and social events will be offered throughout the summer school. These are likely to include: Visits to Lucca, Florence, Massa Carrara, Siena, San Gimignano, Concerts in Torre del Lago, Pieve a Elici.....

Please note that most of these activities incur additional costs, which are payable by students in Pisa.

Certificates

All students who complete the programme will receive a 'detailed certificate' which lists the educational objectives of the Summer School, activities, number of hours (including Lectures and Special Subject Courses), credits and level achieved.

At the end of any course (Language Course and Special Subject Courses), a student may sit the final exam. By passing the final exam, the student earns 6 CFU/ECTS for the Italian Language Course and 1 CFU/ECTS for any Special Subject Course.

FEES AND PAYMENTS

BASIC OPTION:

60h Italian Language Course: 500 euros

INTENSIVE COURSES:

60h ILC + 12h Special Subject Course (4h x week: afternoon course): 600 euros;

60h + 24h Special Subject Courses (8h x week: afternoon course): 700 euros.

ACCOMMODATION

Participants are expected to find their own lodgings. A list of hotels at preferential rates in different price categories is available online.

DISABLED STUDENTS

(including those with mobility difficulties)
